

Impact of decentralization on infrastructure provision (1)

1. Diminished economies of scale and externality

- Limited scope within its jurisdiction
- Small size and large number of local government
- Coordination by middle tier government

Impact of decentralization on infrastructure provision (2)

2. Expansion of regional inequality

- Depend on own financial resources
- Current central government transfer: adverse effect

3. Weak Human Capacity

- □ Tasks conducted by central government ministries
- ☐ Failure to displace central government officials

Impact of decentralization on infrastructure provision (3)

4. Financial shortfall of local governments

- Capacity to raise money constrained by law
- Local government reluctant to raise tax
- Priority on recurrent expenditure

5. Rent seeking

Weak capacity allows intervention of local elite and bosses

The way forward (1)

- Make functions of governments technically appropriate and practically workable
 - Dimension of infrastructure and corresponding level of government
- Enhance local government capacity
 - Financial and administrative autonomy for hiring highly skilled labour force

The way forward (2)

Overcome financial constraints

- Use of direct contribution by the beneficiaries and of local materials
- Support of central government
- Reinforce local accountability
 - Transparency and participation
