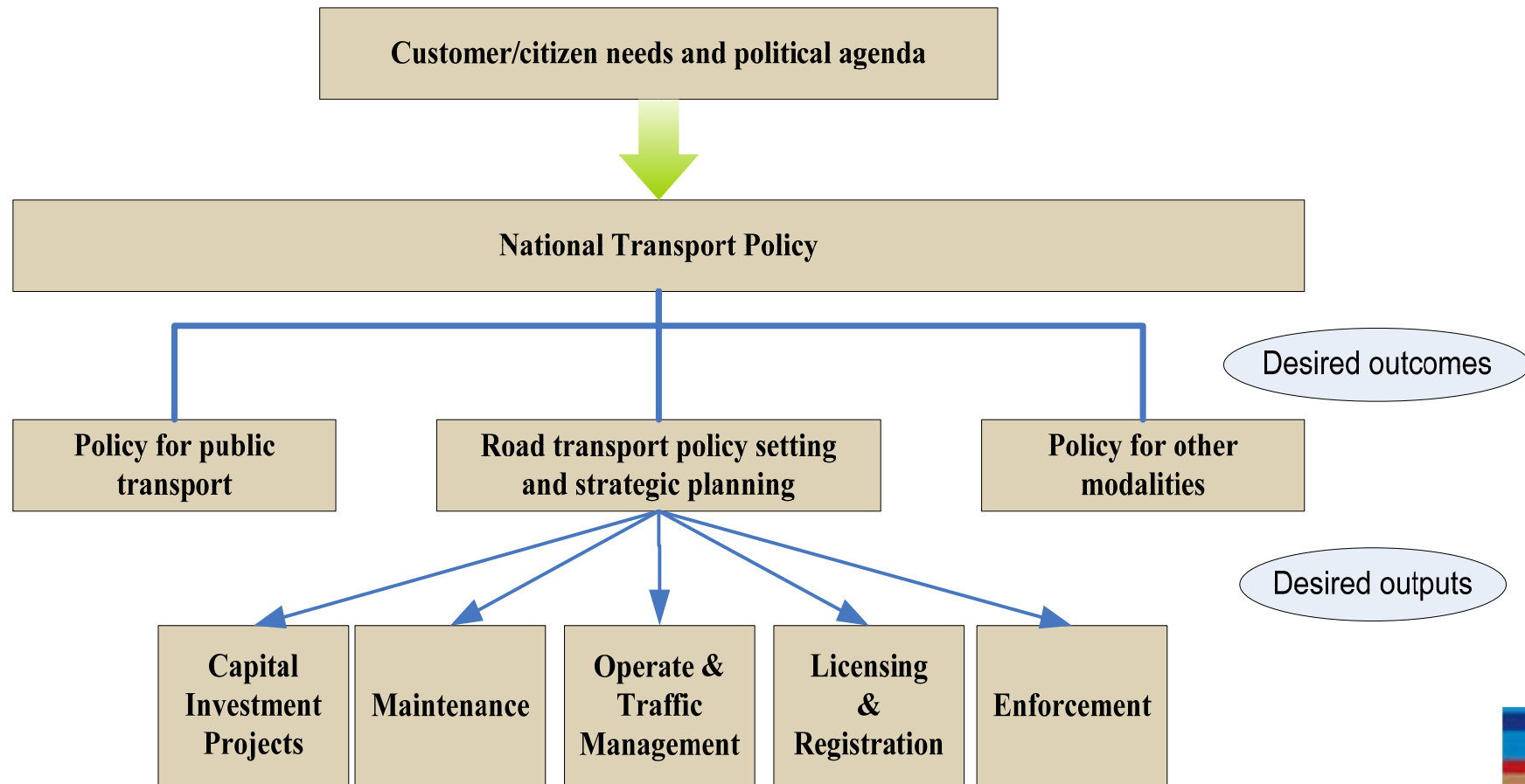

- This depends on the history of
  - The political climate
  - The economical development and development of the road network
  - The (inter) national discourse on how to organize public administration

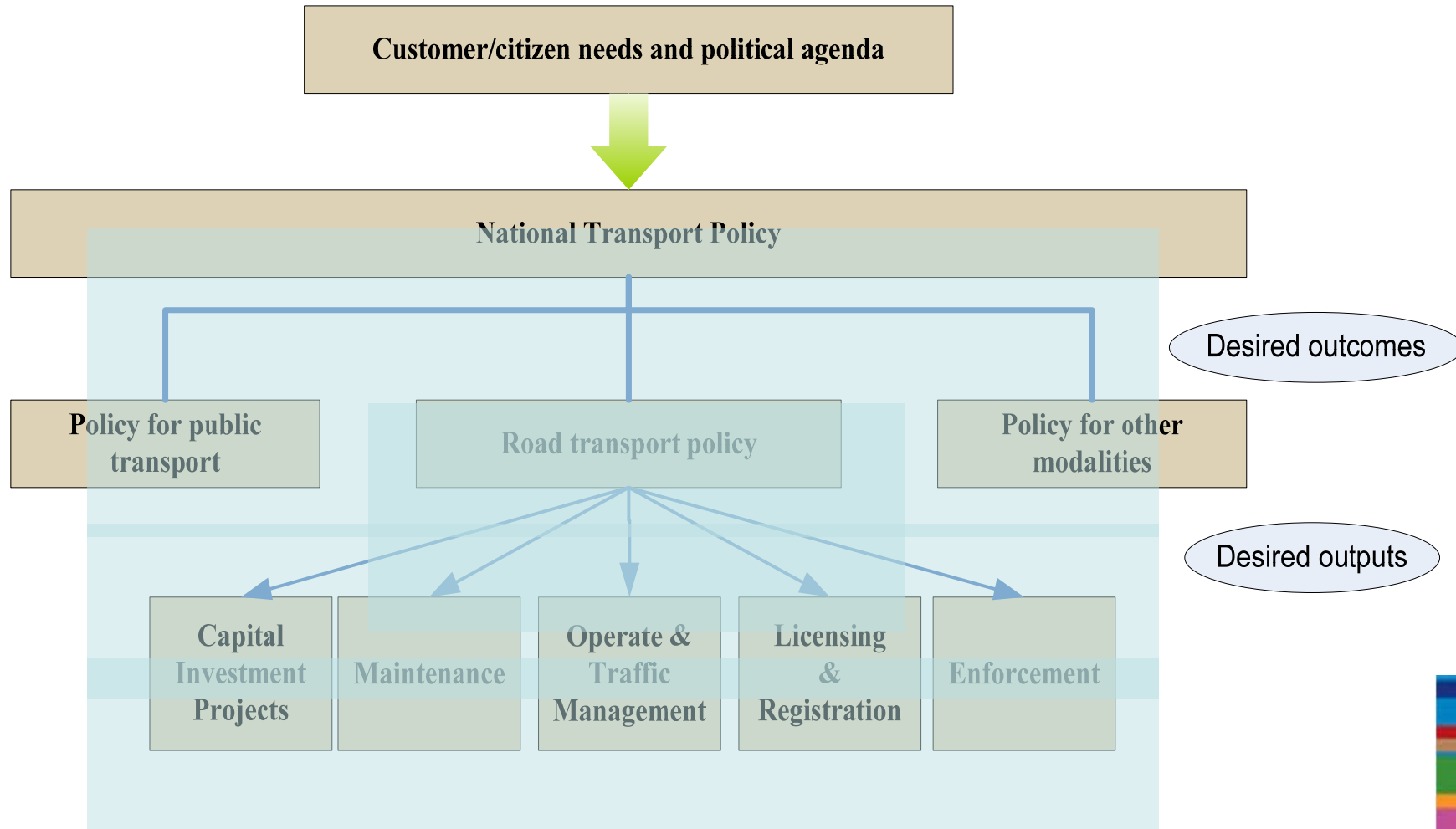

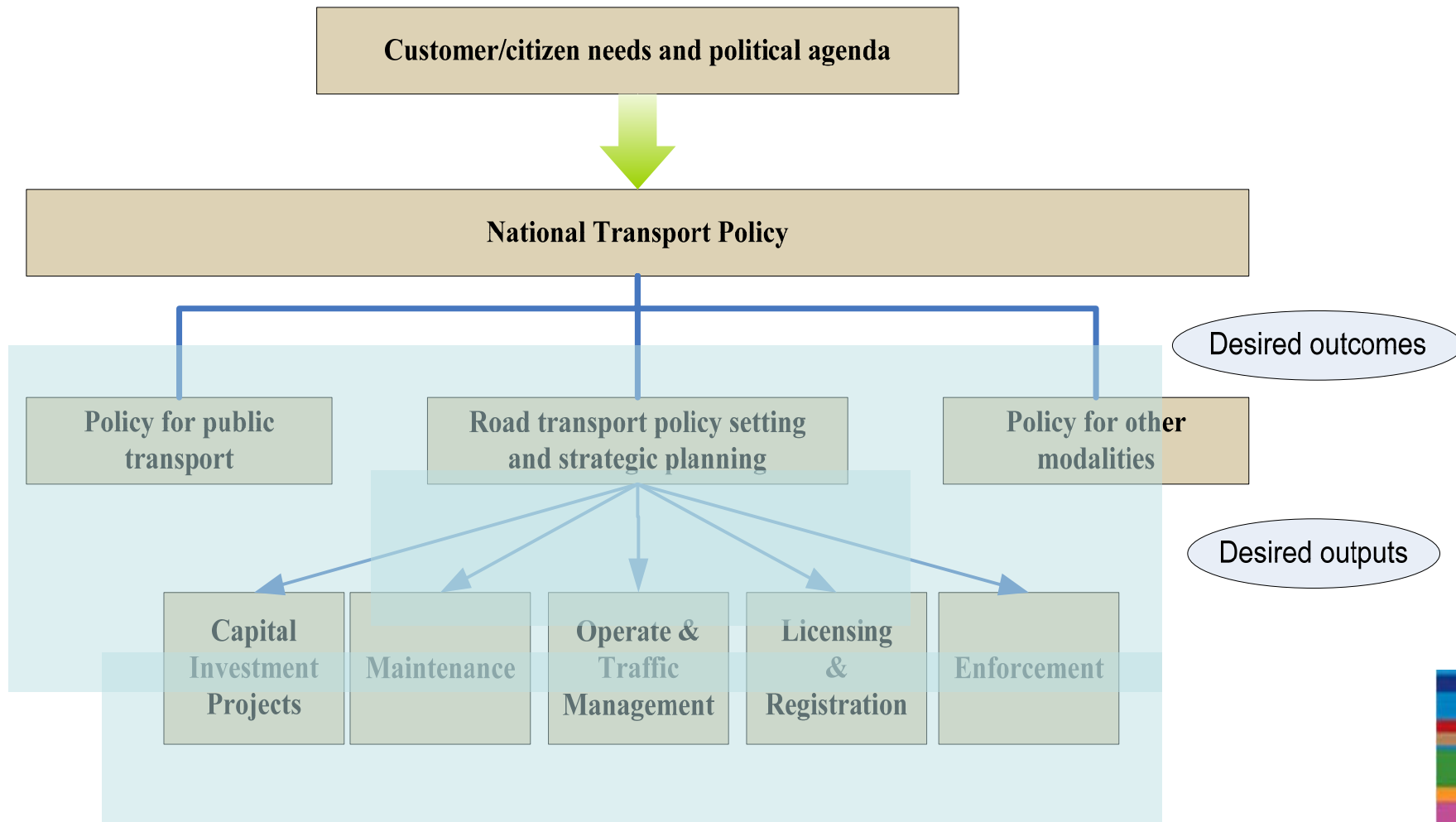

**There is not a one-size-fits-all recipe for a Road Administration on how to organise itself**

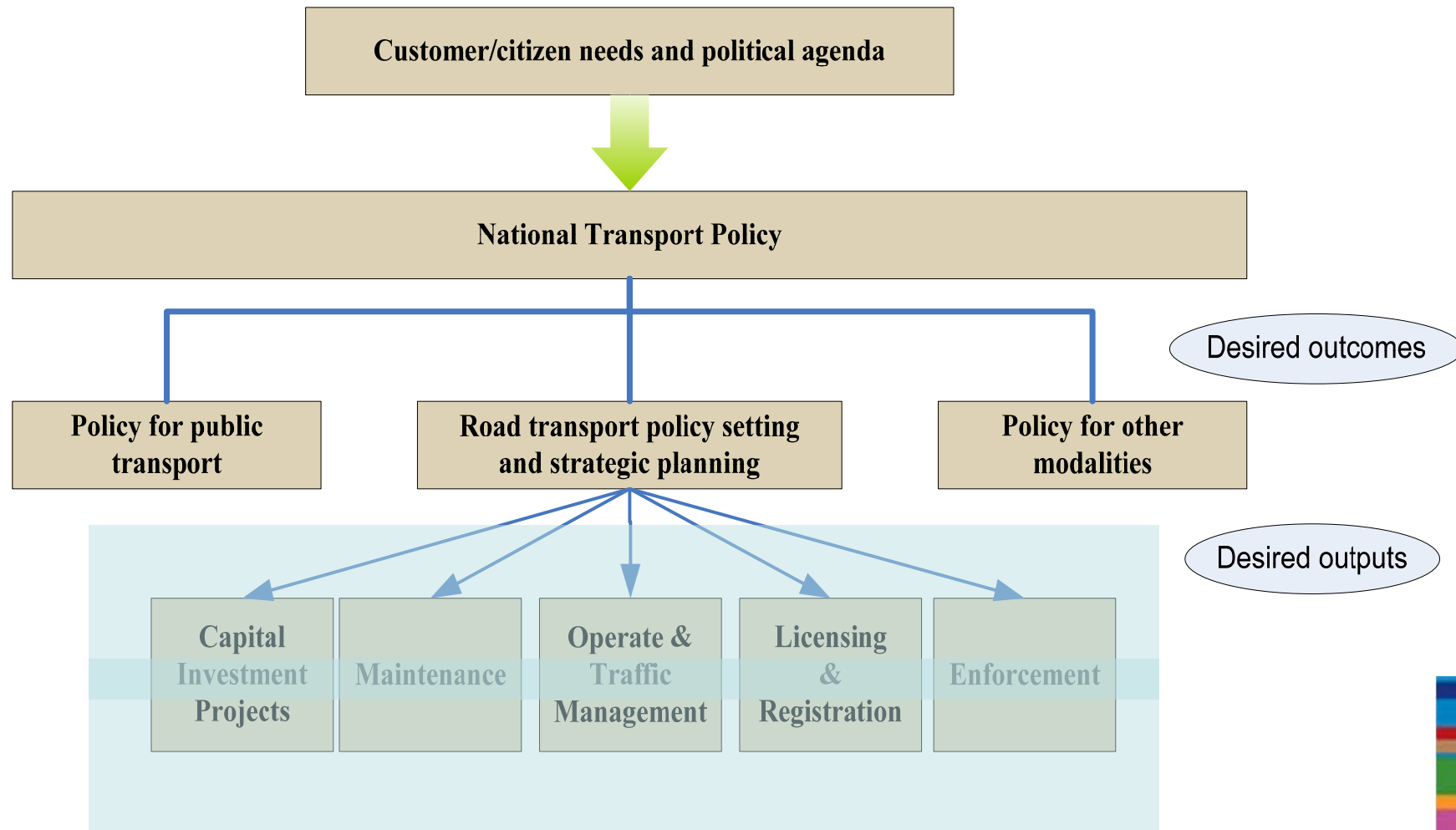
# RA can have different responsibility areas



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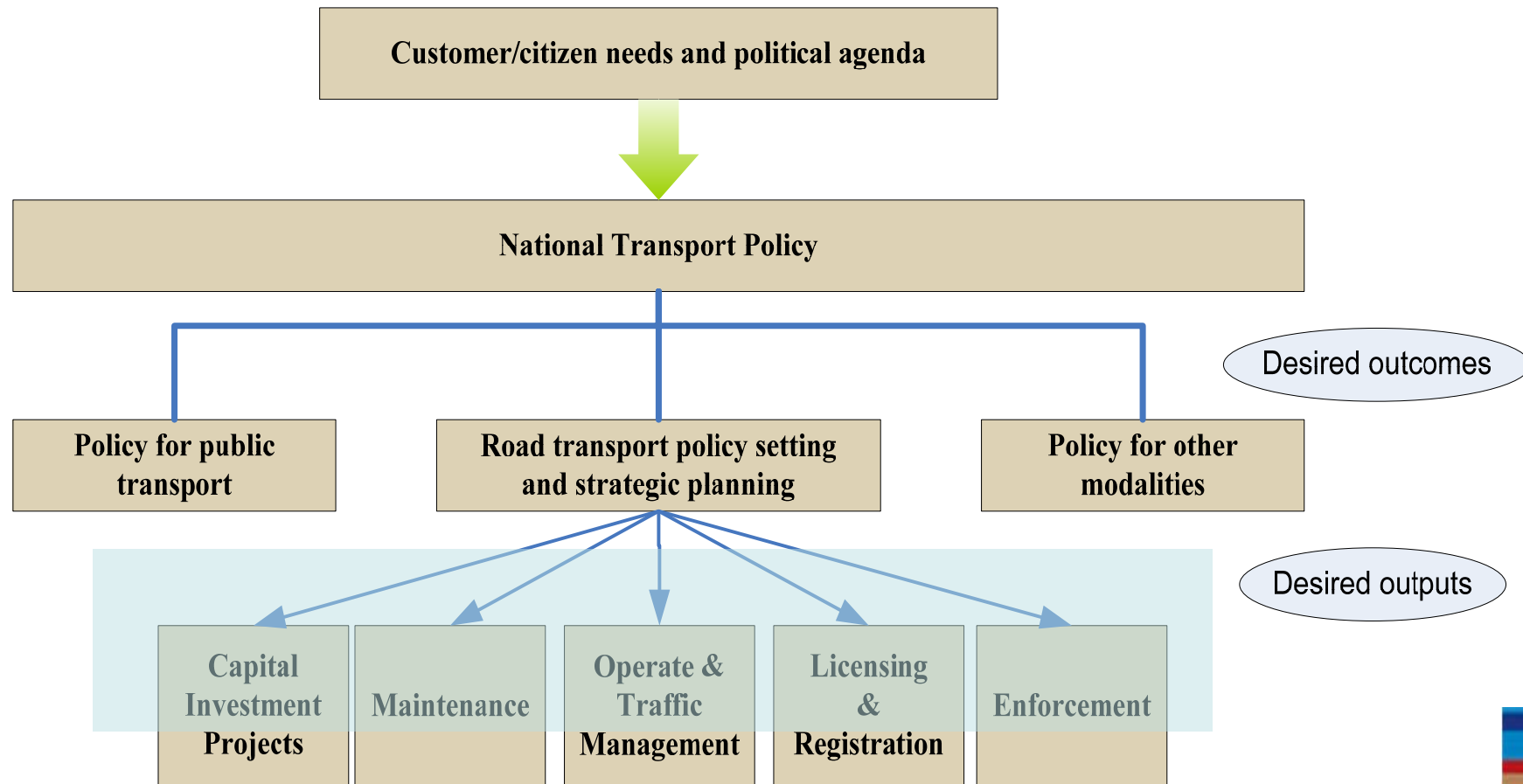


# RA can have different responsibility areas

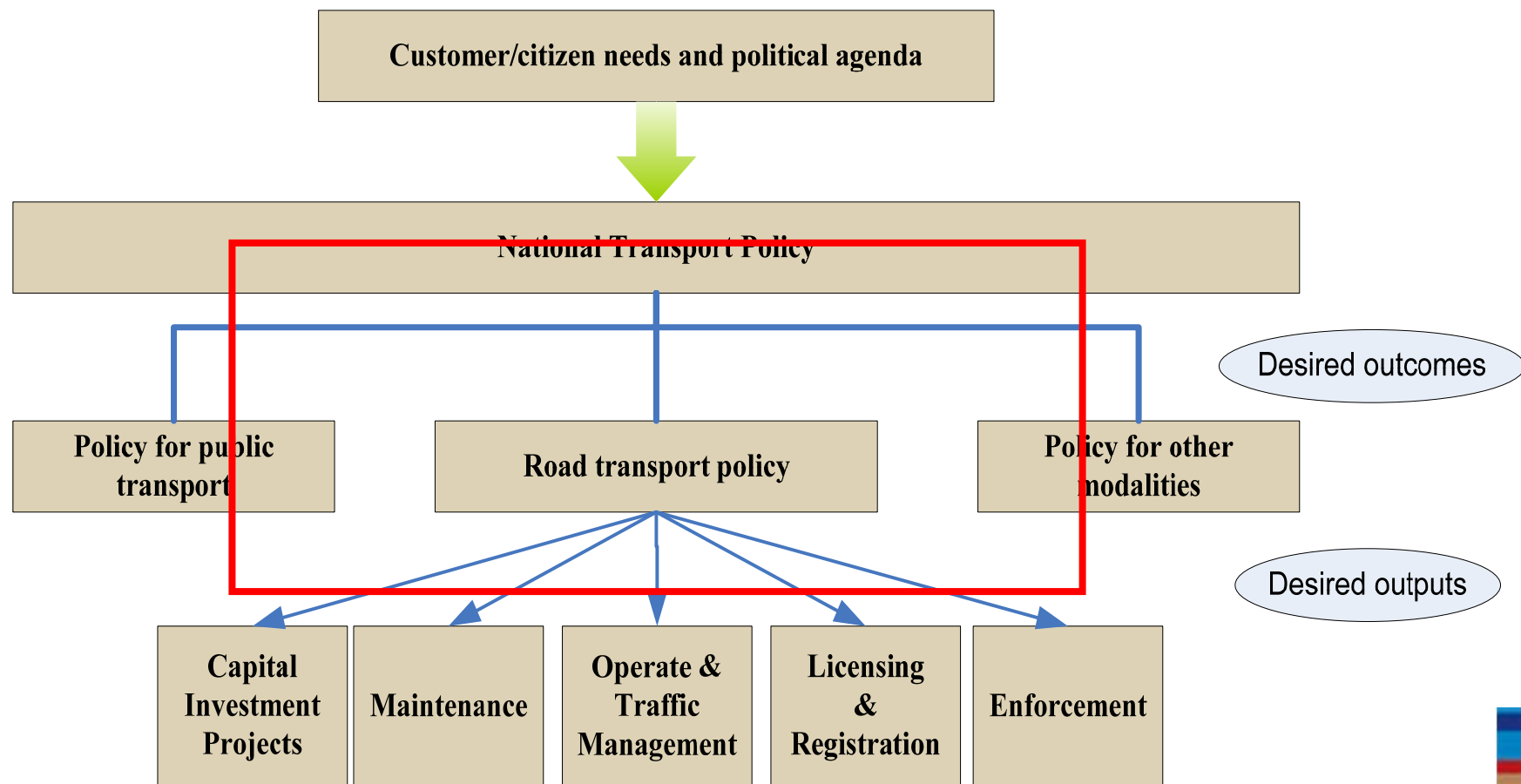




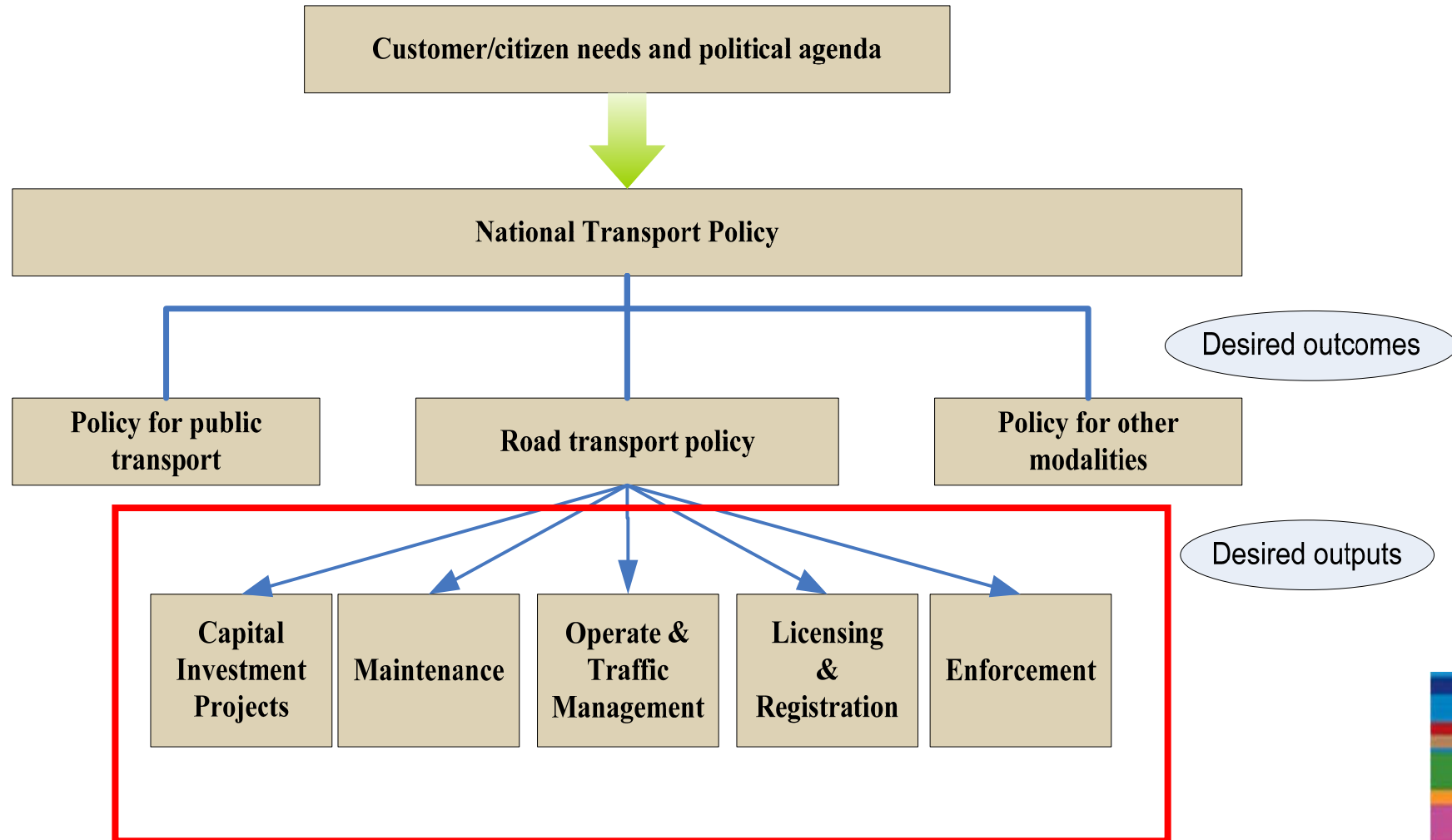
# RA can have different responsibility areas



# Different Responsibilities: Strategic RA



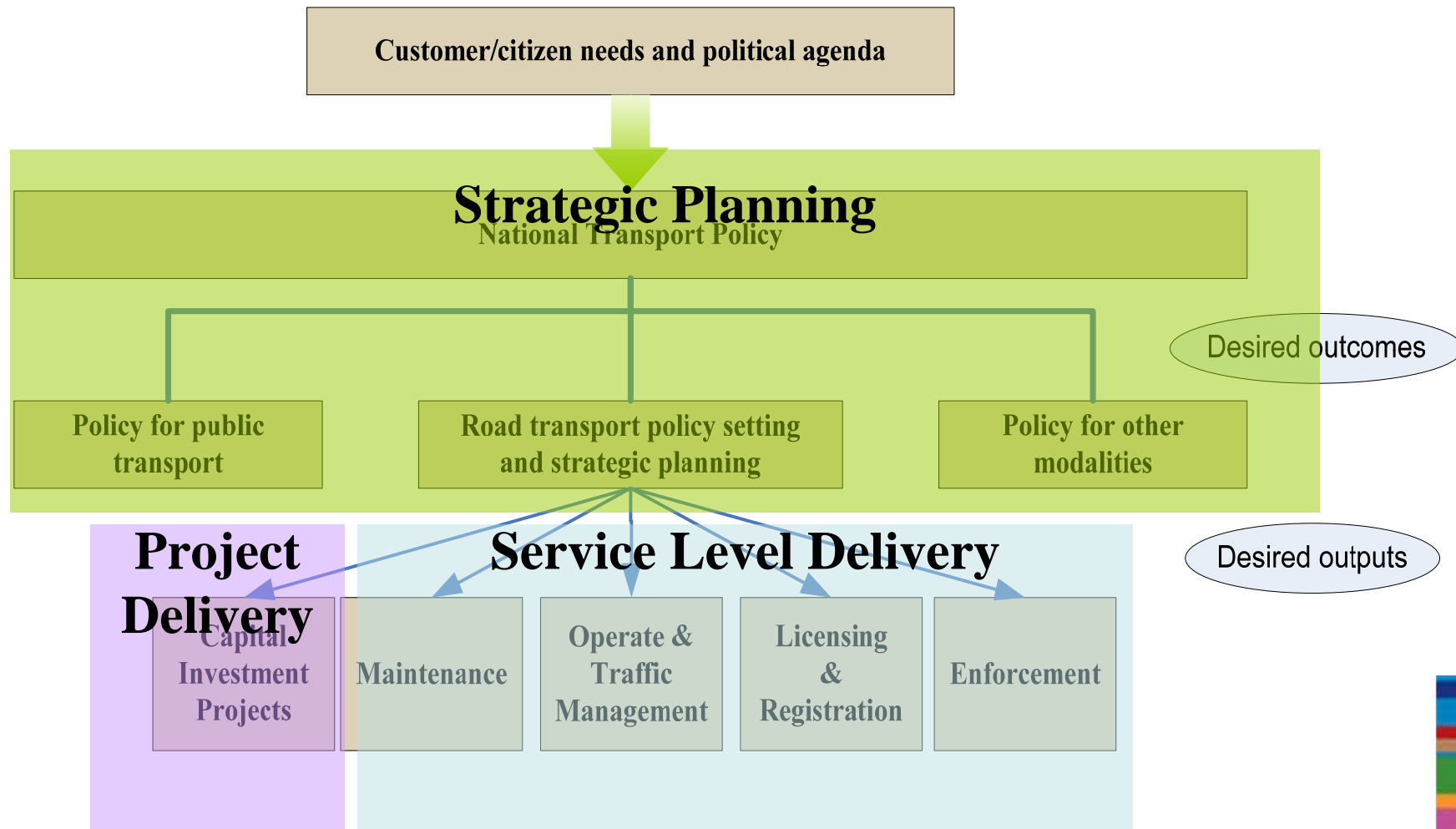
# Different Responsibilities: Operational RA



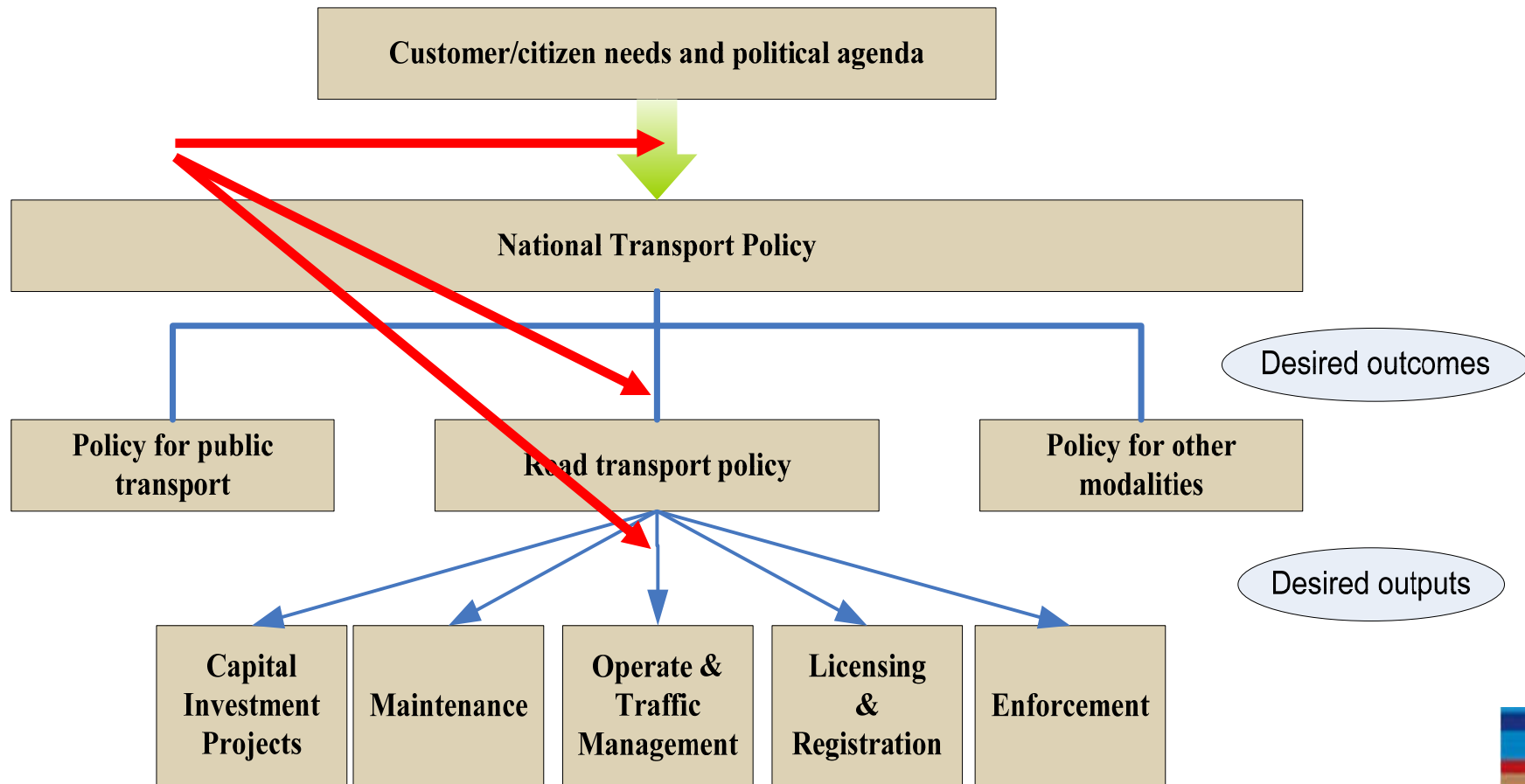
## What could be my focus as a public manager then?

- **Independent of who is responsible**
  - Government
  - A Road Administration
  - Private Sector
- **Its all about the governance of interfaces between these different activities**

## Examples:

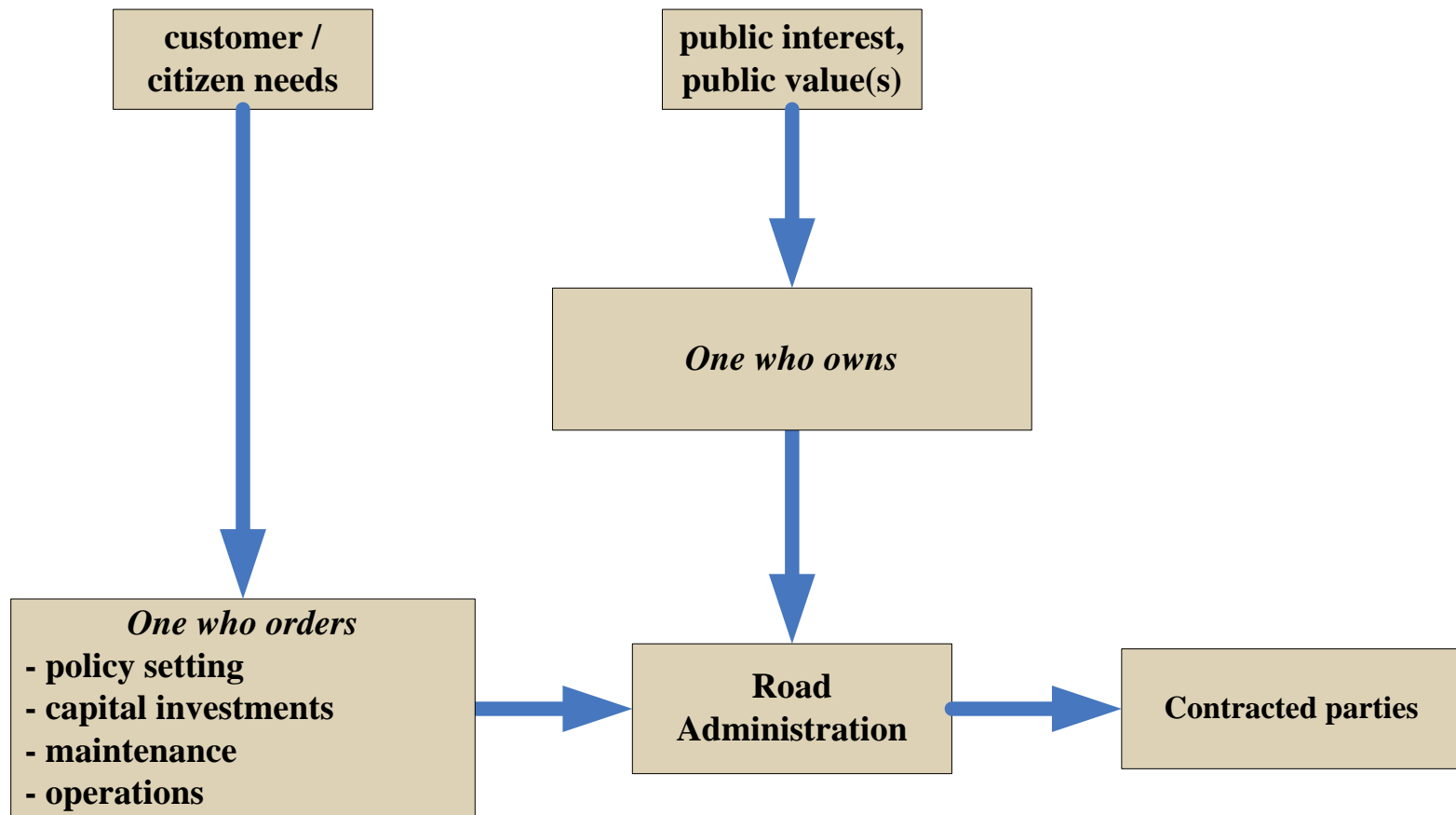
- 1. Interface between National Road Policy setting and Strategic Planning**
- 2. Interface between strategic planning and capital investments**
- 3. Interface between strategic planning and maintenance & operations**

# Means of Governance

- **Through relations**
  - With Customers
  - With other Road Management Network entities
  - With other Stakeholders including owner
- **Through values**
  - Integrity
  - Public value/ Interest
  - Fair, Legitimate, Just
- **Through tools**
  - Organisational structure & processes
  - External Reporting
  - Internal Control
  - Standards of Behaviour



# Introduction: two major attention area's






## General Recommendations

- **It is important to make a distinction between a role of ownership of the RA and the role of customer**
- **Interfaces between elements of Road Administration can be managed in a uniform way**
- **They are internal or external interfaces, depending on the responsibility area**
- **Use a balanced mix of governance instruments for each interface**

## Recommendations continued

- **Policy level instruments are necessary in order to align task specific instruments. It should increase the efficiency and effectiveness**
- **Within the area of Road Management some elements have to be arranged:**
  - Access to all relevant information
  - Methods of decision making and deliberation
  - Have a clear understanding of what tasks to perform
  - Divisionalize RA internally if responsible for more than one task

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- Major finding of T.C. 1.3: Governance concerning task execution/delivery or other roles depends on the function, e.g construction or maintenance;
  - Governance focuses on the interfaces. It is irrelevant what type of parties, public or private, are involved: construction requires control on time, quality and budget, by the RA or another entity, within the RA or between RA and private parties, etc....;
  - Thus the role of the RA determines its governance: which interfaces does it manage, for which functions.
  - RA organisation, structure, control and relations with other Road Management players depend on the responsibility areas of each party.
  - RA evolution is caused by changes in its responsibility area
